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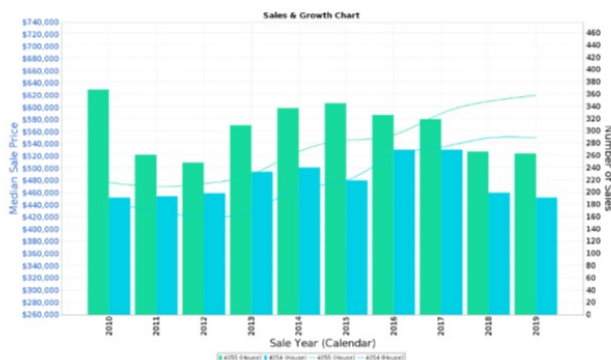

## 2022 Smoke Alarm Countdown Deadline for QLD Smoke Alarm Compliance. It's closer than you think!!



Every rental property in Queensland must meet the new smoke alarm rules by 31st December 2021. For more information about what will make your investment property compliant contact our office on 07 3164 7000.

### What happens after you apply for a rental?

Depending on which real estate agent is managing the property you've applied for, processing times can take between 24-72hrs for approval. If this happens the agent will contact you and start the lease agreement process.

### Why does application approval take so long?

It might seem like a long time, but there are multiple checks taking place. These include but not limited to: Checking tenancy default databases, double checking that you've fully completed your application, assessing whether you can afford the property (based on your annual income and the asking rent), verifying current and previous living arrangements, verifying your employment status, checking references.

Once these checks have taken place, an agent will submit all details to the owner, the final decision of who is successful and not successful is always the landlords decision.

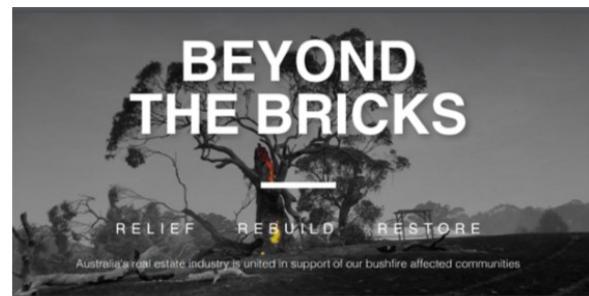
### Beyond the Bricks Campaign

The Wahminda Cycle Link is almost complete. Stage 1 included pathway widening along Samford Rd from Iron Bark Gully to Wahminda Park. Stage two was redesigned to go around the water catchment and includes a new bridge, and Stage 3 includes a bridge crossing across Kedron Brook.

### Beef Ragu (serves 4)

This quick beef ragu that goes best with Pappardelle pasta for an easy meal.

- 720g Guzzi's Pappardelle Pasta
- 400g Three Aussie Farmers pulled BBQ beef
- 1x jar Jamie Oliver Tomato & Italian Red Wine Pasta Sauce
- 200g grated carrot
- 1 x chopped onion
- Shaved parmesan for serving

1. Bring to boil one large saucepan with salted water. Add pasta to boiling water, stir gently until pasta separates. Cook for 6-8 minutes approx. Drain from water, ready to add to meat and sauce mixture.

2. Add onion to pan, cook until brown. Add carrot, beef and pan to heat. Add cooked pasta and sauce to meat mixture. Stir until mixed allow to simmer until hot. Serve with parmesan cheese.
